What type of study?	This study will examine symptoms, treatment, and genetics in people who have a diagnosis of Parkinson's disease (PD)
Who can participate?	English-speaking patients, diagnosed with PD, who self- identify racially as either Black or White.
Why is this research important?	Our aim is to collect more information about symptoms, treatment, and genetics in Black/African patients due to limited research and genetic information for this demographic. Your participation will help us better understand similarities and differences of the disease in different groups of people.
Length	A single, 2-3 hour visit at the study center.
Requirements	Study activities include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Signing an Informed Consent Form. • Completing surveys, cognitive assessments, and movement tasks. • Having your blood drawn for genetic testing. • Optional, free genetic counseling on genetic test results.
